Explore Sacred Geometry and the crop circles with hands-on drawing exercises & look at the link between crop circles and consciousness

Welcome!

A very warm welcome awaits you at our event!

This course is designed to give you a deep dive into the phenomenon of crop circles. Drawing the geometry of crop circles and learning how to reveal the hidden codes within is a primary focus. Additionally specially created visualisations and meditations will facilitate an understanding of the intersection between crop circles and consciousness.

Together we will explore the language that underpins the phenomenon and learn about the creative principle it reveals. We invite you to join us on this fun adventure, together we will explore crop circles - experiencing the magic, beauty and harmony therein. By co-creating a community of like minded explorers this workshop is a joyful journey of discovery out of which new insights might emerge for you.

In this series of 4 weekly sessions we will be exploring in depth the beautiful crop circle that appeared at Ogbourne St. George in the summer of 2020, a breathtaking mandala and one of the most aesthetically beautiful crop circles of that year.

Two eighteen-fold flowers sit within one another around a central circle circle and then they are framed, or contained, by nine stunning, stylised-petals. These nine petals are fascinating, as nothing quite like them had been seen in crop circle design before. They are very reminiscent of the lotus petals often drawn in Hindu or Buddhist culture.

Its 18-fold geometry, while unusual, was not new to the crop circle phenomenon. However, the nine stylised petals illustrated that this circle was every bit as much about nine as it was about eighteen. Both of these numbers are deep and rich in symbolism and meaning.

Course Programme

The course extends over 4 x 3-hour sessions held weekly.

Course Outline

- Aim To explore the beauty, meaning and mystery of crop circles
- Objective To provide you with a new lens to view and enjoy crop circles and give you tools to explore the phenomenon in a deeper way.

- 2. Visualisations and contemplation with the shapes
- 3. Group sharing
