This course is designed to give you a deep dive into the phenomenon of crop circles. Drawing the geometry of crop circles and learning how to reveal the hidden codes within is a primary focus. Additionally, specially created visualisations and meditations will facilitate an understanding of the intersection between crop circles and consciousness.

Together we will explore the language that underpins the phenomenon and learn about the creative principle it reveals. We invite you to join us on this fun adventure, together we will explore crop circles - experiencing the magic, beauty and harmony therein. By co-creating a community of like minded explorers this workshop is a joyful journey of discovery out of which new insights might emerge for you.

In this course we will be exploring in depth the iconic and beautiful crop circle that appeared at Cley Hill, near Warminster, Wiltshire, in 2010. This amazing circle was noted for its three-dimensional design It was also special because of the fact that it contained three states of crop within its design. This formation is rich and deep in symbolism and meaning, making it a great candidate for one of our deep dives.

In this course, we will draw this circle, create our own unique mandala from its shape and explore and discuss the symbolism and meaning of the number six, the cube, and that third state of crop, signifying higher dimensional space.

Course Programme

The course extends over 4 x 3-hour sessions held weekly.
